IMMEDIATE SCHOOL NEEDS

THE City and County school boards, Knowing full well the size of the building job in the years ahead, are understandably reluctant to adopt half-measures. They would, of course, prefer to determine the minimum essential needs of the two systems for the next four or five years and put the whole project before the voters, even though the amount might be large.

even though the amount might be large. They can not do so, for the County Government simply doesn't have the leeway, under the County Finance Act of 1927, to issue bonds in the amount needed. The Encelhardt survey said the City of Charlotte needs to spend \$14 million by 1985, and \$8 million or \$10 million more in the next five years. The total for both City and County would be much greater.

There are-two ways in which the County's borrowine canacity may be increased:

I. If the friendly test auit brought by the Cily Government to force Mecklenburg County to assume outstanding Cily school bonds is won, the County's borrowing limit for schools will automatically be boosted from 5 per cent to 8 per cent of its assessed valuation.

City Superintendent Garinger says that preliminary study of next year's enrollment indicates that from one to three more classrooms will be needed in every existing elementary school. Already all the space is taken, and there are double sessions in some schools. The single package school bond election would be easier to sell to the voters. It could encompass every immediate need, could show what was to be done in each neighborhood of the city. No one would become disgrunted because his school was not included.

Some st million for 35 million borrowine canactly exists now, and that will care for some of the most pressing needs. We have every confidence that the people of Charlotte will approve an early start on the program, and we believe they will understand the problem if the school authorities explain it to them.


