EGYPT PUSHES MOBILIZATION

Woman Killed In Suez Clash

CAIRO, Egypt.—A British military spokesman said today an Egyptian woman was killed and her male companion wounded by British troops who tried to crash through a British roadblock in the embankment. The spokesman said an Egyptian officer immediately made an official protest against the shooting, which occurred last night after a week-end lull in the canal zone. Egypt meanwhile moved toward a war footing.

ROYALTY ENDS PRAIRIE TOUR, HEADS FOR U. S.

FORT WILLIAM, Ont.—Princess Elizabeth and the Duke of Edinburgh said farewell to the broad ranches of Canada's prairies and headed east today toward the United States. The royal couple was to visit a grain elevator and appear before 8,000 school children here today before taking plane at noon for Montreal. They fly from there to Washington Wednesday for a two-day visit with President and Mrs. Truman.

Enemy Fails In 3 Screaming Assaults

By ROBERT EUNSON U. S. EIGHTH ARMY HEADQUARTERS, Korea.—(AP)—Screaming Chinese Communists today charged an Allied-held hill mass southeast of Kumsong but failed to regain the positions Allied forces took three days ago.

No Progress Made In Truce Talks In Korea

Each side has proposed a demarcation line. The U. N. wants it generally to follow the current battle line, mostly in North Korea. The Reds want the line to go back as much as 15 miles, giving up such hard won positions as the Taehyeon, the Penobscot and Heartbreak Ridge. In exchange, they offered the Ongjin Peninsula to the West. The U. N. says that has little military value.

KUMSONG NEUTRALIZED

Kumsong, 30 miles north of Parallel 38 and overtime enemy strong point, has been neutralized, an Eighth Army staff officer said. Allied troops had been in and out of the rubble city for days but have not occupied it because of heavy enemy gun emplacements behind the town.

Gigantic Indies Plot Disclosed

JAKARTA, Indonesia.—(AP)—The United States has disclosed a gigantic plot that discovery of Indonesia's top officials from President Soekarno down, had resulted in the arrest of 15,000 people. The plot, he said, was discovered last August. Its targets, in addition to the President, included the Indonesian cabinet, Hatta and all Cabinet ministers.

Even If Cease-Fire Is Arranged Allies To Stay In Korea 'Some Time'

SOMEWHERE IN KOREA.—(AP)—Gen. J. Lawton Collins, U. S. Army Chief of Staff, said today that Allied forces "will have to stay in Korea for some time if a cease-fire is arranged." He said that would not be practical to pull Allied troops out of Korea by the end of next month under a new point-of-rotation formula.
