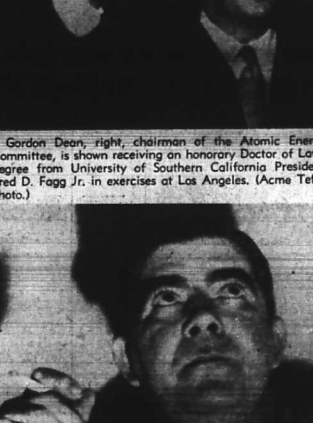


Rep. Pat Sutton of Tennessee displays a swollen fist, the weapon with which he subdued a would-be hollown first in the Capitol in Washington.
