Buffer Line Details Delaying Agreement

By ROBERT B. TUCKMAN MUNSAN, Korea — Hopes faded today for final approval of the Korean buffer zone issue this week as staff officers reported agreement on only half of the 145-mile cease-fire line.

The officers pored over maps for five hours 10 minutes Saturday, comparing United Nations and Communist versions of where the line of battle would be.

U. S. Col. Howard Lewis, official U. N. command spokesman, said it was still too early to say the staff officers had agreed.

He said a "major" difference would be the line of territory or a strategic point such as the Ohio valley.
