Teitelbaum Shakedown Story Grand Jury Inquiry Delay Seen

By KARL R. BAUMAN WASHINGTON—The start of a grand jury inquiry into Abraham Teitelbaum's story of an alleged attempt to shake him down for \$500,000 in exchange for relief from tax troubles appeared likely today to be delayed until next month.

The committee has wanted to question Grunewald for some time but has been unable to do so because he was in Georgetown, Guyana.

Dr. Dean DeWand, counsel to the House investigating group, said Grunewald had been subpoenaed to appear before it on Thursday.

Gen. Dean Reported Included On Rolls

By O. H. P. KING MUNSAN, Korea.—(AP)—The Communists turned over to the United States today a list of 11,559 prisoners, including 3,198 Americans.

The list includes all prisoners of the Korean war in their hands. The U. N. gave the Reds a list of 192,474 Chinese and North Korean prisoners.

Communist newsmen at Panmunjom said Associated Press photographer Frank Noel was also listed. Lists were exchanged Tuesday when Communist true negotiators suddenly capitulated to U. N. demands.

Dean has been reported wounded, dead or captured so many times in the past 17 months his wife and mother today found reports that he was in the hands of Communists "almost too good to be true."

Word that the Reds list him among their prisoners is the most definite statement on what happened in him since he led a small party of his 54th Division out of flaming Taegjon in the early months of the Korean War and then went to hunt for more American stragglers.
