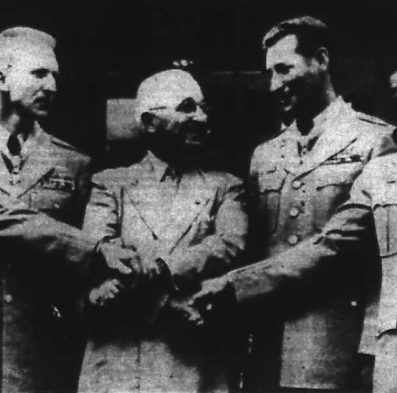
Gen. Almond Given Cluster For DSC
