Thus, by following a policy espoused by the Communists, but accomplishing it by non-totalitarian, though revolutionary means, the United States corrected an evil, cut the ground from under the Communists and helped establish democracy in Japan.

It is interesting and relevant to note that the man primarily responsible for this reform was not Dean Acheson, but Douglas MacArthur. It was he who issued the vigorously-worded orders.

Of course it is sometimes true, as Mr. Dooman avowed, that anti-capitalist policy is in line with Communist objectives. Although it is not often mentioned any more, the political interests of Communists and democracies have sometimes coincided.

Throughout the entire period from inception of the land reform program to its completion, General MacArthur took a personal interest in the work, consistently and steadfastly supported it, and saw it through to a successful completion.

The United States Government adopted a revolutionary policy which rapidly broke up the holdings of the large rural capitalists. The Rural Land Reform Directive of Dec. 9, 1945, stated that its purpose was to "eliminate those pernicious ills which have long afflicted the agricultural structure of a land where almost half the total population is engaged in husbandry."

Further, we believe it is extremely regrettable that a vigorous "anti-capitalist" land reform such as that directed by MacArthur in Japan was not applied in Germany and Italy. The world cried for revolutionary reform—we repeat it—revolutionary leadership of the United States following World War II.
