Gromyko Didn't Appreciate Congressman's Map Of Russia

Rescued UN Unit Hits Back At Reds

Allied Troops Fight Out Of Enemy Circle

U. S. EIGHTH ARMY HEADQUARTERS, Korea—(AP)—Allied troops drove Chinese Communists out of two hills today on the Western front where Reds earlier encircled two United Nations outposts.



Communist units (white arrows) supported by tanks opened up surprise attacks in the Imjin valley (shaded area), threatening to encircle UN troops before UN planes helped free them. Allied intelligence believe this may be the start of an all-out Red offensive with eventual use of European "dumper" troops based near Kumsong. On east central front, UN ground troops occupied new hills in consolidating drives which gave them "Bloody Ridge" (1), and "Punch-bowl Valley" (2). (Acme Telephoto).
