Rising River On Rampage

Thousands Flee Ohio Flood

MARIETTA, O., (U)—Thousands of people in Ohio and West Virginia moved to higher ground today as floods caused by heavy rainfall sent the Ohio River and other streams out of their banks. At least three persons were dead or missing. The turbulent Ohio struck hardest at Wheeling, W. Va., lying midway between the banks of the river. Partial evacuation of the island's 10,000 population was under way. Most of the island's streets were impassable early today and if the river continues to rise as expected the entire island will be covered by water. At Powhatan Point, O., some 15 miles south of Wheeling, the local chief Powhatan broke his moorings on the Ohio side, hit a pier at a railway bridge and sank. No one was aboard. The Powhatan Mining Co., which owned the boat, estimated the loss at \$30,000. The mass evacuation of Ohio River residents is only the beginning of the river's rise on the Ohio. It was expected to hit 12 feet above flood stage in at least a dozen Ohio and West Virginia communities. Many of them were isolated when high water covered nearby highways. Gov. Frank J. Lausche has ordered Ohio National Guard units to stand by on an emergency basis. The Red Cross at Washington sent coats, blankets and disaster supplies. All along the Ohio River residents swayed down from Pittsburgh, where they were evacuated to what is expected at Pittsburgh, where the Allegheny and Monongahela Rivers merge to form the Ohio, the Ohio crested at 28.7 feet early today, five feet above flood stage.

ANTI-STALIN TOASTS AT PARTY CAUSE ARRESTS

BERLIN—(AP)—A Russian underground reported today Soviet secret police swooped down on a Red army officers' drinking party reached a "down with Stalin" stage. The "Russian Information Agency," composed of refugees from the Soviet Union now in West Germany, said the incident happened in East Berlin, 40 miles west of Berlin. The town is heavily populated with Red army units using barracks which once housed Nazi "fighting battalions." The report said the officers gathered in a casino to celebrate the Bolshevik revolution anniversary Nov. 7. After food and drink, shouts of "down with Stalin" were heard. Pistol shots followed. Officers were arrested and taken away. Details of the incident leaked to the West recently through a Red army deserter.

Judge Waring, Foe Of Segregation, Retiring

CHARLESTON, S. C.—(U)—Federal Judge J. Waring Waring, whose outspoken approach to end racial segregation have drawn the criticism of White Supremacy Southerners, announced today he plans to retire next month. Waring said he had written President Truman telling him of plans to retire as a District Court judge in Feb. He was the dissenter in last year's 2-1 decision which a special three-judge court ruled that school segregation could continue segregated public schools but must equalize facilities for white and Negro children. The decision—given by a special three-judge U. S. District Court in Charleston, S. C.—was vacated directly to the high tribunal by lawyers for the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP).
