#### THE EXCHANGE OF ATOMIC SECRETS

THE BRIJEN, if develops, are quite as a capable of exploding atomic bombs as are the Americans and Russians. \*Prime Minister Churchill has used the occasion of his report on Britain's successful detonation to point up the need for exchange of atomic information between his country and ours. This is not the first overture the Prime Minister has made. He stressed the lack of co-operation when the British, at considerable expense, built testing equipment for this explosion which in many ways duplicated our facilities.

The United States, for good reason, has been reluctant to divulge the most tender secrets of our nuclear scientists. Canada, the United Kingdom, France have their Communist espionage problem, even as we do. It would be unwise, and could be tragic, to give secret and important information to an ally who, however friendly, did not maintain an atomic security system as rigorous as our own.

Atomic collaboration between the allies seems to have deteriorated in recent years. During World II Canadian, British and U.-S. scientists worked hand in hand Tragically, the security system devised was insufficient. All this occurred during a period when the pooling of all talents and resources of the free world took on more urgency. How shall this impasse be resolved? First of all, it seems, is required a recognition of the fact that atomic weapons, like con-ventional ones, will likely be used, in any fature war. If inter-allied exchange of data on naval matters, for example, is desirable, is it not all the more desirable to exchange data on things atomic, which in all likeli-hood, will have much greater importance in any future war?

If this is so, then the basic problem reduces itself to establishment of a security system which, to the satisfaction of our security officials and Congress, will insuge that allied scientists given access to these secrets are as carefully screened as are our own, that data and equipment permitted them be as carefully guarded as it is at

them be as carring present.

One way to accomplish this might be to require that our data and equipment be kept in this country, with approved allied scientists allowed equal access with ours toishis material.

Surely a satisfactory and safe program can be worked out by reasonable men who will bend themselves to the task.

### THE ABILITY OF BLOODHOUNDS

WEVE always wondered just how blood bounds managed their difficult tasks of tracking down men. Now the scientists are offering a hand by way of explanation. The study of hereditary differences in human body chemistry, asys a Science Service dispatch froma-London, may one day produce Firsults ranging from an explanation of how bloodhounds can accurately distinguish between human scents, to providing clues for the use of genetics in medicine.

The dispatch then goes on to show that the clue to the bloodhound's powers may lie in the discovery of definite abnormal substances in the sweet of people suffering from an hereditary idiosyneracy called phenylketonuria. The scientists suggest that we shall soon

find sweats are as different and as characterfind sweats are as directed and as characteristic as bloods and salivas. The bloodhounds may depend on such individual differences in the chemicals in sweat for its unerring ability to distinguish between the scents of individuals. Of course, the bloodhound doesn't have a
