Dialogue Due For A Change When Ike And Truman Begin Washington Talks

WASHINGTON (AP)—It probably will be smiler, handier and politer words when a couple of men who were snarling at each other's political throats today will get together today at the White House.

President Truman and President-elect Eisenhower are expected to have a talk, or at least a look for a few hours, all those charges of lying and cheating which they threw at each other from one end of the country to the other.

Vacation Ended, Ike Turns To State Affairs

AUGUSTA, Ga. (AP)—President-elect Dwight D. Eisenhower turned his best today on a two-weeks "partial vacation" here and flew to Washington for a history-making conference with President Truman.

The general's chartered plane was airborne at 10:38 a. m. for a stop of two hours and a half to the national capital. It was due at the Military Air Transport Terminal across the Potomac River from the White House at 1:25 p. m.

In a brief farewell as he and Mrs. Eisenhower boarded the plane at Bush Field, the President-elect said his rest here had not been complete because of heavy correspondence.

"It has been a great burden," he said, "but there has been great satisfaction because it evidences great determination of our people to do the job which is before us."

He said further that he looks forward to his program for the next four years receiving "critical and intelligent" rather than blind support.

CAVY DISCUS TRIP
Eisenhower noted that he had been asked to speak on his visit to Korea but the time of departure is still indefinite and he would not be able to discuss the trip until he returns.

A civic welcome and a parade in an open car to the White House awaited Eisenhower in Washington. Thirty-five minutes after his landing outside the capital, he and Truman came face to face for the first time since June 2.

Then the general had just returned from Europe and had given up his command of the North Atlantic forces to campaign for the Republican presidential nomination.
