ONE OF THE most appealing campaign promises voiced by Republicans was that of reducing Federal spending and taxes. Following his meeting with Eisenhower at Morningside Heights Senator Taff said:

General Eisenhower emphatically agrees with me in the proposal to reduce drastically our expenditures. His goal is about \$70 billion in the fiscal year 1954, and \$60 billion in the fiscal year 1955. That would mean a reduction in taxes to the \$80 billion level for the year 1955. Of course I hope we may do better than that.
