Indictment In Federal Court

Harvey Morris Faces Tax Case  
Harvey Morris, prominent Charlotte businessman and McClellan County Senator in the North Carolina Legislature, was indicted today in Federal District Court at Durham on two counts alleging failure to file income tax returns for the years 1948 and 1949.

The announcement that the indictment was returned in Judge Johnson J. Hayes Middle District Federal Court was made in The Charlotte News by U. S. District Attorney Bruce Holt in a telephone conversation early this afternoon.

The announcement said the indictments "alleged tax evasion on two counts."

The first count, as explained by District Attorney Holt, alleged that Mr. Morris in 1948 had a gross income of \$17,783.81 and was required to file a Federal income tax return not later than March 15, 1949. Mr. Holt added that Mr. Morris "willfully and knowingly failed to file the required return, and consequently any taxes due to the Federal Government were evaded."

The second count of this indictment, Mr. Holt continued, alleged that for the year 1949 Mr. Morris had a gross income of \$44,419.56 and that he failed to file the return.

26 Reach Safety After Ship Wrecks Off N. C.

MOREHEAD CITY (AP)—All 26 crewmen of the freighter Miguel reached shore safely in a single lifeboat today as hurricane-whipped winds broke the 2,600-ton Panamanian ship in two.
