Sutton, Partner Found Guilty Of Robbery

NEW YORK (AP)—Master criminal Willie (The Actor) Sutton was convicted today of staying a \$64,000 bank holdup while he was the nation's most-wanted fugitive. An all-male jury returned guilty verdicts after more than a nine hours of deliberations against Sutton and his key accomplice, Thomas (Scop) Kling.

WAIVES HEARING REINHART IS BOUND OVER

Albert Raymond Reinhart Jr., Myrtle Beach, S. C., hotelkeeper, waived a preliminary hearing this morning on charges he murdered former State Senator Emmett H. Bell in a Wilmington and wounded Bell's lawyer in the law building.

The young attorney, also reportedly shot by Reinhart in the law building yesterday, was reported to be in "satisfactory condition" after spending "a fair night" at Memorial Hospital.

Reinhart was formally charged with murder in the first degree and with assault with a deadly weapon with intent to kill.

Reinhart was bound over to the grand jury. He is to appear in court for a preliminary hearing on the charges on Monday.
