Truman's Action Ruled Illegal

WASHINGTON—(AP)—The Supreme Court ruled today that President Truman's seizure of the steel industry was unconstitutional. Within minutes CIO President Philip Murray called a nationwide strike of his 650,000 steelworkers.

In the absence of a wage agreement, our members have no alternative other than to cease to work. In a statement issued a few minutes after he was told of the court decision, Murray said: "At the same time I call upon the various steel companies to participate in collective bargaining conferences with the representatives of the United Steelworkers, looking toward the perfection of a contract firmly based upon the recommendations of the Wage Stabilization Board."
