Until Nation Freed
American Troops To Stay In Austria

VIENNA, Austria (AP)—U. S. Secretary of State Dean Acheson said today American troops will remain in occupied Austria until its independence is assured.

He blamed Russia for the failure of the Big Four to write a treaty of independence. To a news conference of Austrian and Allied newsmen, he said: "Make no mistake about it. Of the four powers in Austria, three want to go home."

Acheson is making a two-day state visit to his crossroads country of East and West. He came here from Berlin.

His visits to the two Communist-ruled cities are aimed at bolstering the courage of their people by reaffirming Western support for their objectives.

In the case of Austria it is the completion of a treaty of independence, long blocked by Soviet delaying tactics.

Beaches, parks and resort areas were jammed with millions trying to escape the scorching heat in Chicago, rivalling the 11th day of 90s or higher temperatures in June...

It was a record June 29 reading of 93 and was followed by a day of 96 and high humidity tomorrow.

In St. Louis—wary from five successive days of temperatures above 100—the prospect was for more of the same for the next several days.

Thunderstorms struck New York City about midnight, dissipating the threat of immediate hot weather.

Similar storms hit Washington, D. C., and various parts of Maryland, which has had its heat by the hot spell.
