SEOUL, Korea — (AP)—A North Korean security officer who fled the Panmunjom neutral zone and surrendered today said he saw about twenty Russians dressed in Chinese Red uniforms at the Yalu river airfield across the Yalu river from Manchuria. The officer, Lt. Lee Dong Yup, told Allied newspapermen in an interview that this was in June, 1951, and he understood that they had installed anti-aircraft guns.
