Two Die In Crash

The flaming wreckage of this truck lights up the sky about two hours after it collided with a passenger car on Highway 74 early this morning. The truck's cargo of paint and chemicals exploded and burned furiously following the wreck in which two unidentified men were killed.

Dead Are Unidentified After Pre-Dawn Wreck On Monroe Highway

MONROE—Two persons were killed and two others were seriously injured early today when an express truck out of Charlotte and a sedan crashed and burned fiercely on Highway 74.

CRASH ON CURVE

On a slight curve some four miles east of Matthews, the sedan apparently struck the express truck, which was heading for Fayetteville with a general merchandise cargo that included paint and other chemicals.

EXPLOSIONS START

From the truck came loud explosions. Cans of paint or chemicals were finally slung into the air and sailed upward, some of them as high as 100 feet.

ASPHALT CRUMPLED

The truck burned until about 9 A. M. The fire had been so intense that the asphalt in the highway crumpled.
