Internal Revenue Projects Reorganization Of Bureau Disapproved

WASHINGTON — (AP) — The Senate Expenditures Committee today disapproved President Truman's plan to reorganize the Internal Revenue Bureau. The vote was 7 to 5.

The resolution of disapproval now goes to the Senate floor where the final decision will be made. Majority leader McFarland (D-Ark.) has said it will be taken up there next Tuesday.

The committee, which has held four weeks of hearings on the plan, discussed it behind closed doors for an hour before voting. Only yeas were recorded. The bill is a new and urgent plea for approval.

The vote was taken on a resolution of disapproval introduced by Senators George (D-Ga.) and Milliken (R-Colo.).
