How Bobby Was Slain

Kidnaper's Confession Bared

KANSAS CITY (AP)—The grim story of Carl G. Bender, who admitted killing little Bobby Greenleaf as he struggled for his life was told today in the ex-covict's confession.

The confession was made public for the first time when it was read at the federal kidnap trial of Hall and Mrs. Bonnie Brown Heady, the alcoholic divorcee, before a jury called to determine whether they shall die for their crime.

Hall, a 34-year-old player who turned crime when his inherited fortune was squandered, showed little sign of emotion as the 36 pages of gruesome detail were read by A. S. Bender, one of two FBI agents who took the confession.

Hall related how he had driven the boy and Mrs. Heady across the state line into Kansas soon after 6 p.m. He said he had been abducted from a private Catholic school in Kansas City.

"Bobby had not uttered any resistance and had not made any utterances," Bender said.

"After stopping the car, I got out on the driver's side, went to the rear and let the tailgate down, then I went into the car to the side opposite the driver and entered the car."
