Senator Jenner said of him, on Sept. 15, 1950:

The next year Senator McCarthy wrote a book entitled America's Represar From Victory, The Story or George Cattery Marshall, eword, 'sold China out to the Communists.' For page after page the senator calumnies the general and the Marshall Plan, paints them as instruments of the Communists. Former U. S. Communist chief Earl Browder, McCarthy wrote, 'Gave almost a complete blueprint of the Marshall Plan... The Marshall Plan fitted perfectly with Communist Russia's desire for a power vacuum in all of Western Europe.' (Senator McCarthy, incidentally, voted for it.)

Perhaps if he were not a man of peace General Marshall would counter the charges hurled against him. He has chosen to estand on his record, which despite the shrill denunciations, remains great. Mean-while, the cackling cacophony of his de-tractors blends into one shrill voice.

It is our conviction that the Supreme Court will adhere to the letter of the law and uphold the right of the states to have dual systems of schools, even though the individual members of the court may thoroughly abhor segregation. Were the court to do otherwise, when the law is so clear, it would amount to writing new laws by judicial decree. And the power to legislate, as the justices well know, belongs to the Congress.
