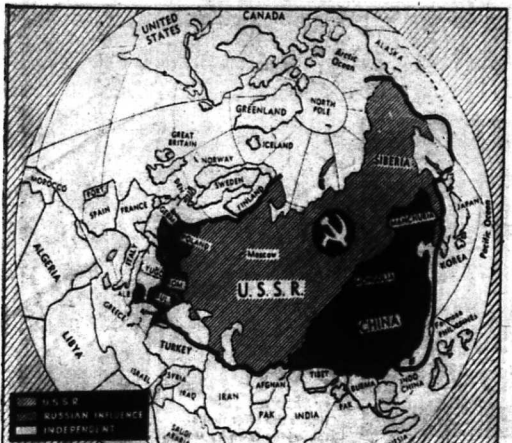

(diagonal lines) and several satellite nations (cross-hatched lines). Someone else now may inherit that "empire" as his successor. Possible successors are Secret General Malenkov, Deputy Premier V. M. Molotov and Soviet Police Chief N. S. P. Beria.
