New Hoover Commission Takes Office

WASHINGTON (AP)—With President Eisenhower looking on, a new 12-member commission on government reorganization headed by former President Hoover today took office at the White House.

U.S. Supreme Court Justice Harold H. Burton administered the oath. As he did so, he read the long list of appointees sworn not only to uphold the Constitution but that they are neither Communists nor Fascists, nor members of any organization advocating the overthrow of the government by force.

The commission is expected to organize quickly and get down to the job of trying to save money and make the government more efficient through reorganizing and streamlining federal functions.

Hoover was chairman of a reorganization commission which operated during President Truman's administration. That group's studies were credited by Truman with saving millions of dollars.

The new commission is composed of seven Republicans and five Democrats.

Sen. McClellan (D-Ark.) a member of the old commission and the new one, in an interview, he intends to urge the commission not only to make reorganization recommendations but to draft legislation or proposed executive orders to submit with its report.

MEMBERS LISTED The Republicans on the new commission are Hoover, Arthur S. Flemming, director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation; Robert C. Byrd, U.S. senator from West Virginia; Robert A. Taft, U.S. senator from Ohio; and Robert A. Taft, U.S. senator from Ohio.

The bride wore a long-trained white gown. McCarthy was in formal morning dress, black frock coat, white shirt and necktie. He wore a small white spray of flowers in his lapel.

The bride's maid, Miss Gerwin E. Tankersley, of Washington, was a bridesmaid. McCarthy, escorted by his brother, William P. McCarthy of Chicago, walked through a side aisle to the altar.

Polish Catholic Cardinal Confined To Monastery

WARSAW, Poland (AP)—Poland's Communist government has barred Stefan Cardinal Wyszynski, head of the nation's Roman Catholic Church, from his Prague diocese for showing an uncooperative attitude.

The cardinal was the second major churchman disciplined by the Communist regime this month. Last week a Polish military court sentenced the bishop of Kielce, the nation's primate later made a cardinal in 1948 on charges of collaborating with the Nazis. He was freed from prison the others from 6 to 18 years.

Cardinal Wyszynski is the third prince of the church to be restricted by a Communist government. Hungary arrested Josef Cardinal Mindszenty in 1949 for anti-state activities. He was freed in 1952.

Reds Would Talk Germany, World Tensions

PARIS (AP)—The Soviet Union came up today with two proposals for international conferences — a Big Four Power meeting on Germany and a five power meeting including Red China to discuss the entire problem of world tensions.

The two proposals were announced in the latest Soviet reply to invitations from the United States, Britain and France to meet on Oct. 12 in Lugano, Switzerland, at a conference on the German and Austrian treaties.

The Soviet note, about 10 typewritten pages, was delivered yesterday to the three Western embassies in Moscow and relayed to Washington.
