Skilled enlisted personnel may command as much as \$150 a month extra in proficiency pay. The same amount is available for captains through colonels as responsibility pay. There are liberal (and logical) raises for generals and admirals, the men with the greatest responsibility but until now shamefully underpaid.

Patterson Smears Himself With Truth

PATTERSON, candidate for gover-nor, is either scornful of the truth or the most innocent Boy Scout in the modern history of Alabama

Patterson has now confirmed what

Patterson has now confirmed what The Montgomery Advertise told the State of Alabama last Thursday. Patterson finally admitted yester-day that Bob Shelton of Tuscaloosa, Grand Dragon of the Alabama Klan, has been his friend and political as-sociate.

Patterson, who has lately been a Patterson, who has lately been a fugitive from the press and live TV programs, was tracked down in Chilton County yesterday and asked once again if he knew Grand Dragon Shelton. Patterson finally admitted to both The Advertiser and Birmingham News that he did know Shelton, but did not know that Shelton was a Kiansman.

THIS is preposterous. For, as The Advertiser showed last Thursday, Shelton actually wrote a letter to the editor of the Tuscalossa Graphic and signed himself: "Robert M. Shelton, Grand Dragon, Realm, Ala." The letter was about the Klan.

Therefore, everybody in Tuscaloosa County could read it in the paper that Shelton was a Klansman. But Patterson, while admitting close per-sonal association with Shelton, asks Alabama to believe that he did not know his pal was a Klansman, and the Grand Dragon at that!

THIS seems to be the Patterson pattern. Sometime back it was disclosed that, while crusading against loan sharks, he himself held stock in a loan firm.

When confronted with this documented truth, Patterson and his supporters cried "smear", Then Pattersons asid in substance, "I thought it was a bank."

Patterson at that time was not considered a strong candidate for governor and nobody bothered to put the spotlight on him and ask ques-

Judge Wallace made a statewide broadcast accusing Patterson of being wrapped in a bedsheet with the Grand Dragon. Every newspaper in Alabama carried an account of the disclosure by The Advertiser.

Every day the letters to the editor column crackled with disputes between Patterson and Wallace supporters over Patterson's Klan connections. There were editorials. There was another story about a Hale County klansman boasting of his support of Patterson.
