Banana Bran Muffins

1 cup sifted flour
3/4 teaspoon baking soda
1/4 teaspoon salt
1/4 cup sugar
1 cup bran
1 egg, well-beaten

2 tablespoons sour milk or buttermilk
2 tablespoons melted shortening or salad oil
2 cups thinly sliced, ripe bananas (13 to 4 bananas)

*Use fully ripe bananas... yellow peel flecked with brown. Sift together flour, soda, salt and sugar into mixing bowl. Add bran and mix well. Combine egg, milk, shortening or salad oil and bananas. Add to dry ingredients, mixing only enough to dampen all flour. Turn into well-greased muffin pans. Bake in a moderate oven (375°-F.) 35 to 40 minutes, or until muffins are done.

Makes 8 large or 16 small muffins.

Blueberry Scones

2 cups sifted flour
3 tsp. baking powder
1 tsp. salt
2 tbsp. sugar
1 1/2 cup blueberries

Mix and sift flour, baking powder, salt and sugar. Cut in butter with 2 knives or pastry blender or rub in with fingertips.

Umstead Talks
With Carroll

RALEIGH (P)—Gov. Umstead and State School Supt. Charles F. Carroll met with the state's top legal talent yesterday to discuss problems posed by the U. S. Supreme Court decision on segregation.

Following the hour long conference in the governor's office, Umstead issued a statement which said:

"Many of the complicated questions as to the effect of the decision of the Supreme Court upon the school situation in North Carolina were discussed. No decisions were reached and the governor requested that the attorney general and his staff to continue to study the opinion as it relates to the Constitution of this state. Other conferences will be held from time to time."

Meeting with Umstead and Carroll were Atty. Gen. Harry McMillan and three of his lieutenants, Asst. Atty. Gen. I. Beverly Lakin and Claude Love. Also present were Chief Justice M. V. Barnhill of the State Supreme Court and Asst. Budget Director D. S. Coltrane. All declined to comment.

Umstead said he requested McMillan to accompany him to the June 10 Richmond conference called by Gov. Thomas Stanley of Virginia. Southern governors will discuss problems posed by the decision and how to meet them.

Vacancy Law
Not Too Clear

RALEIGH (P)—Two state officials agreed yesterday that state law is rather vague on the way party nominees should be selected to fill the vacancy created by the death of Clyde B. Hoey.

Atty. Gen. Harry McMillan "is not as plain as it might be" and "needs a little clarification" by the Legislature "would be in order."

Secty. Raymond Maxwell of the State Board of Elections said McMillan had indicated that Democratic and Republican state executive committees should select party nominees whose names will be on the general election ballot.

McMillan said the law does not spell out this procedure in so many words but that "it has been the recognized procedure that where a vacancy occurred after the time for primary filing closed the nomination should be made by party executive committees."

Both McMillan and Maxwell agreed that the law is plain in giving Gov. Umstead the power to appoint someone to serve in the Senate until the general election.

PEMBROKE — Registration for the summer session of Pembroke State College will be held Monday, June 7 at 8 a.m. in Room 4 of Old Main Building, Wednesday, June 9, is the last day to register for a full load, announces Clifton Oxendine, director of the summer session and dean of the college.

The maximum amount of credit allowed for a term of 6 weeks is 9 quarter hours, Dean Oxendine explained.

Courses to be offered include: Beginning Typewriting, Guidance in Secondary School, Oral Interpretation, Play Production, Workshop in English, Shakespearean Comedies, Introduction to Philosophy, Library Science, Teacher's Arithmetic, College Algebra, General Psychology, Education Psychology, Rural Sociology, The Family and Elementary Spanish.

The course in Philosophy to be taught by President R. D. Wellons, will run June 28 through July 16, the three hour course Library Science taught by Miss Marjorie Kanable, college librarian, will run June 7 through June 25.
