Violence, Tenderness, Riotous Humor Hit Screen

Charlotteans have three new movie offerings this week.

"Dondi" is now showing at the Carolina. Opening Thursday at the Manor is "The Last Sunset." "The Angry Silence" is now showing at the Vistula.

Heading the list of holdovers is "Exodus," the story of the dramatic creation of the state of Israel, showing at the Center Theater.

"Ring of Fire" is a fast-moving tale of hoodlums and a rap-

ing forest fire, is held over at the Plaza.

"Thunder in Carolina," a violence story of fast cars and the men who drive them, is now showing at the Imperial.

A POPULAR comic strip comes to life in "Dondi." It's a tender and sometimes hilarious story of a war orphan and a group of GIs.

An European war-widow, Dondi (David Kory), wanders into

a military outpost on the Italian border on Christmas Eve.

Six American soldiers take the starving child in to their hearts and fit him out in a cut-down army uniform twice too large for his 43-pound frame.

The six men are shipped home thinking Dondi is left behind. They find him stowed away on the ship.

In the confusion of arrival the boy gets lost. Dealey (David Janssen), a millionaire GI playboy, aided by his singer sweetheart (Patti Page), launches a nationwide search for the little fellow, in a tense and moving children's drama.

VIOLENCE EXPLODES in a small factory town when a rebellious worker wages a fight for his individual freedom in "The Angry Silence."

Travers (Alfred Burke) comes to the quiet town of Mel-sham and begins to organize them, refuse to stop work they become the victims of calculated violence.

A wildcat strike is called by a newly formed works committee, at Travers' instigation. When a dozen men, Tom Curtis (Richard Attenborough) among them, refuse to stop work they become the victims of calculated violence.

Connolly calls on Tom and his

Italian-born wife Anna (Pier Angeli) and hints at trouble if he continues to step out of line.

Furious at being threatened, Tom ignores him.

When the strike is finally settled, Tom is "sent to Coventry" by his fellow workers and an "angry silence" prevails.

The firm strikes out at forcible conformity in a powerful climax revolving around a second strike and an "accident" intended to teach Tom a lesson.

JAZZ NOTES

Lionel Hampton is a musician whose career has spanned nearly 30 years and several musical styles. He has progressed from swing through pop, rhythm 'n' blues and now dwells in the borderland of progressive "soul" jazz.

Hampton gained his first fame as a sideman of Benny Goodman's. He and his vibes were an integral part of the Goodman quartet (clarinet, vibes, piano and drums).

After World War II Hampton gained new popularity as one of Norman Grantz' "Jazz At The Philharmonic" stars. He was featured on several records and toured the country with the JATP shows.

When the bloom faded from this musical rose, Hampton formed a young band of Negro musicians who played a new night stands from Maine to Florida. It was a time when rock 'n' roll was unheard of but music with a beat was popular with a large part of the Negro population and high school and college students.

Lionel gave the people what they wanted and gained a reputation as quite a showman as well as a musician. But don't fool yourself—Lionel Hampton is a fine jazz musician and if his fans let him know that's what they want to hear, that's what they will get.

Here's hoping the folks who turn out to hear Lionel and his 12-piece band tonight at Park Center will get the "right" message across. Here's hoping the crowd lets Lionel know it's interested in his talent as a musician not as a clown.

CHRIS CONNERS, her trio, Louis McLendon and the Noces and the Bill Hanna quintet are also on the program. The four-hour show gets underway at 8 p.m.

An event of this type has been a long time coming. Let's hope this first one in some years isn't the last one for a while.

CIA Denies Dulles Out

WASHINGTON (AP)—A spokesman for the Central Intelligence Agency has denied reports that CIA Chief Allen W. Dulles is about to resign.

The denial came yesterday on the heels of a report broadcast by NBC that Dulles would hand in his resignation when President Kennedy returns from his series of conferences in Europe. NBC said the 60-year-old Dulles would cite age and health as his reasons.

The CIA spokesman laughed when told of the reports. He said he saw Dulles only two hours earlier and he looked in the best of health.

About a month ago, informed members of Congress expressed belief that a drastic shakeup of the CIA was in the works, with Dulles on his way out.

Following the ill-fated Cuban invasion of mid-April, in which the CIA was involved, a task force of investigators was formed to look into possible changes in the intelligence agency's setup.

Gen. Maxwell D. Taylor (ret.), former Army chief of staff, heads the task force.

Philippine Leader Seeks Second Term

MANILA (AP)—Philippine President Carlos P. Garcia today was nominated for reelection by acclamation by the ruling Nacionalista Party.

Garcia, who became president in May 1957 on the death of Ramon Magsaysay, is seeking a second four-year term in the November election.

Brendan Behan To Fight Charges

HOLLYWOOD (AP)—Boisterous Brendan Behan says he'll fight charges he was drunk and disorderly in a Hollywood barroom.

The Irish playwright didn't appear in Municipal Court yesterday, his lawyer said, because he was working on a screenplay. A jury trial was set for June 30 after attorney Max Solomon entered pleas of innocent to three misdemeanor counts against Behan.

The Irishman, free on \$103 bail, claims he was just singing a song Wednesday night when the barroom's manager placed him under citizen's arrest.
