Police Broaden Hunt For Killer Of Little Girl

MIAMI, Fla. (AP)—Police broadened their search today for the brutal killer who kidnapped and murdered Judith Ann Roberts, but little progress was reported.

Detective Lt. Chester Edwards, chief of the homicide bureau, said police "have no definite suspects."

Renewed questioning of members of the child's family and other witnesses led police to believe the 7-year-old, blue-eyed Baltimore girl may have been kidnapped from her bed as early as midnight Tuesday.

The time previously had been fixed at 1:10 a.m. Wednesday.

Farm Bill Is Approved

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Senate Agriculture Committee by a 12-5 vote today approved a general farm bill containing many features proposed by the Eisenhower administration.

Police sent out a pickup order for a teen-age boy who disappeared from his home in the neighborhood where the murder victim was kidnapped.
