CHICAGO (AP)—The Illinois American Legion has severed its support of the Girl Scouts of America, charging that "un-American influences" exist in the organization's literature.

Convention delegates took the formal action in a roaring vote last night after 90 minutes of lively debate in which opponents assailed the resolution as "silly."

The resolution charged: 1. That the Girl Scouts text handbook "gives the United Nations and one world citizenship precedence over American citizenship."
