Sometimes municipal aches and pains require a good operation rather than an aspirin. This is the case with Charlotte's hardening traffic arteries. Many streets must be widened in the future as the number of automobiles competing for moving and parking room increases. Yet engineering field work for the designation of seback lines is in progress on just two streets—5th and 6th between College and McDowell Sts.

In 41/2 years, seback lines have been formally designated by the City Council on only eight streets. Since five of these were approved in 1954, it is to be hoped that officials are at last recognizing the need and value of this sort of enlightened planning.

Council action in authorizing seback lines must be taken individually as each street proposed for widening is added to the list on the city's original ordinance. 
