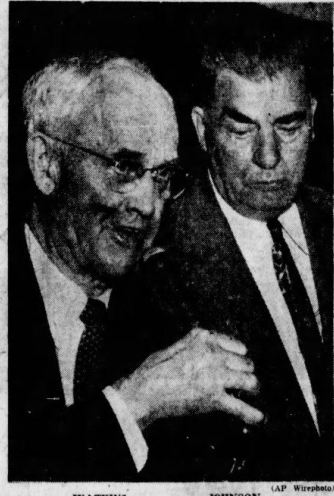
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# ARMY MAN DIES SUICIDALLY

## McCarthy-Army Case 'Jury' Split

WASHINGTON (AP)—Senators who spent 26 turbulent days probing the McCarthy-Army row split last night on whether Sen. McCarthy (R-Wis.) was at fault, but all of them aimed barbs at Roy M. Cohn and two high Army officials. Republicans and Democrats diverged in parceling out responsibility in the controversy. Democrats absolved McCarthy of improper conduct but said he had been lax. Democrats attributed "inexcusable actions" to both the senator and Cohn, former chief counsel to the Senate Investigations subcommittee.

And both sides said Secretary of the Army Stevens had sought to appease McCarthy and Cohn and had failed to stand up for what he regarded as his rights. Both were critics of Army Counselor John G. Adams.

## As European Mainstays U. S. May Look To Other Allies

WASHINGTON (AP)—Strong pressures are reported building up in the government to make Germany and Spain, rather than France, the mainstays of U.S. defense strategy for Western Europe. A major debate on France's role in this country's political-military policies was forecast today by informed officials, who said the central question, starkly stated, is: Should the United States switch its main strategic emphasis, with more of its military aid dollars and supplies, from France to her neighbors on the east and west? Secretary of State Dulles announced yesterday that France's rejection of the proposed European Defense Community, which envisioned a 12-division German army, impels the United States "to reappraise its foreign policy."

## Move Aimed At Johnson Turned Back

### Senate Committee Probing Member

WASHINGTON (AP)—The lawyer for Sen. McCarthy, the Republican, has asked the Senate committee investigating the charges to direct its vice chairman, Sen. Edwin C. Johnson, to clarify his personal stand on McCarthy. Williams argued that the committee ought to drop a charge that McCarthy was contemptuous of a Senate rules subcommittee which investigated McCarthy in 1952. He contended the subcommittee was "acting outside the scope of its authority from the first day" and hence it was impossible for McCarthy to be in contempt of it.

Chairman Watkins (R-Utah) did not rule on this immediately. He said he would order the committee staff to check into the points raised by Williams but also the lawyer.

"We are not out on a wild goose chase in this inquiry," Watkins said. "Earlier, Williams ruled firmly that Sen. Johnson (D-Colo.) has a right to sit in on the hearings regardless of what he might have said about McCarthy in the past. I can't see how any legal objection of any shape or form can be made to Johnson's sitting on the committee that could be maintained as a matter of law or a matter of fact."

## ASTOR'S SECOND SAYS SHE'S HIS LEGAL WIFE

NEW YORK (AP)—John Jacob Astor, now honeymooning in Europe with his third bride, is being sued for separation by his second wife. The plaintiff, Mrs. Gertrude Gretsch Astor, also is asking the New York State Supreme Court to declare she is the millionaire's lawful wife and that the Mexican divorce obtained in July is void. The second Mrs. Astor, a New York resident, filed papers in state supreme court yesterday in a formal peace treaty. 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## Senator Stricken At Flat Rock Home

### FLAT ROCK, N. C.—(AP)—Sen. Burnet Rhett Maybank, 55, a life-long South Carolina democrat, died at his summer home here early today of a heart attack.

Funeral services will be held at 11 a.m. Friday in St. Michael's Protestant Episcopal Church in Charleston, S.C. Burial will be in Magnolia Cemetery in Charleston. Members of his household said he was "feeling fine yesterday" and that death came in his sleep about 12:15 a.m.

His death reduced the number of Democrats in the Senate to 46. There are 48 Republicans and one Independent. In traditionally Democratic South Carolina there was no doubt a Democrat would be named to succeed him.

A successor probably will be named in the general election Nov. 2. Meanwhile, Gov. James F. Byrnes, whom Maybank was elected to succeed when Byrnes left the Senate in 1941 to become a Supreme Court justice, may name a senator to serve until the election.

BOSTON (AP)—The northeast streets of some Cape Cod towns as well as at homes of the more fortunate, were littered with splintered debris. The death toll mounted to 49 and medical estimates placed property damage at from 300 to 500 million dollars. New England was hardest hit by the season's third hurricane which spent itself in Canada after its fierce whirl up the Atlantic coast yesterday.

## New Storm Develops East Of Jacksonville

MIAMI, Fla. (AP)—The fourth hurricane of the season developed today in the Atlantic about 725 miles east of Jacksonville, Fla. The tropical disturbance spawned in an easterly wave which has been under close observation by the Weather Bureau for the past two days.
