DALLAS, April 24 (AP)—Gen. Thomas Power, commander of the Strategic Air Command, was to discuss the military role in the space program at a luncheon Wednesday as the second manned space flight meeting entered its final day here.

"Our work has shown that the Saturn rocket was the correct one for the Apollo program," Von Braun said.
