U. S. Economy

"Our economy is strong; expanding and fundamentally sound." Inflation is now the "principal threat."

Our Defense

Our defense force today "is the most powerful in our peacetime history."

Disarmament

The United States stands ready to negotiate for a "reliable" international agreement as well as to control outer space missile and "rocket development" as well as reduce conventional arms and "reverse the trend toward ever more devastating nuclear weapons."

The Farmers

"The long slide in farm income has been halted and... further improvement is in prospect."

Our Schools

An emergency federal program for school construction "should be enacted without delay."

Race Relations

"We are moving closer to the goal of fair and equal treatment for citizens without regard to race or color."

Hungarian Refugees

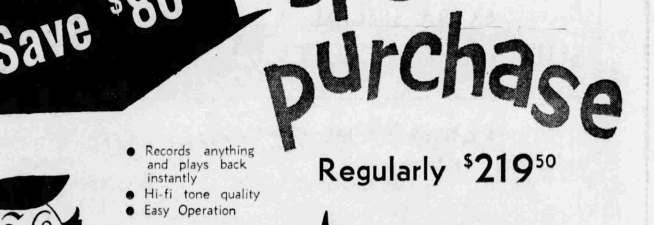
