



Kentucky Seeks Help As Rivers Run Wild

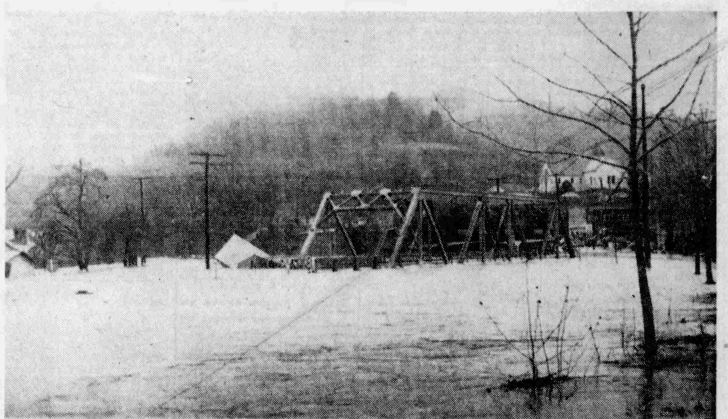
4 States Ravaged; 4 Lives Lost

BARBOURVILLE, Ky. (AP) — Gov. A. B. Chandler today appealed for federal aid in Kentucky, one of four states ravaged by floods that took possibly four lives, caused millions of dollars damage and left thousands homeless.

One man died and another was believed dead in West Virginia. Kentucky counted two dead, both by drowning. Transportation and communications also were disrupted in portions of Virginia and Tennessee.

Before leaving Frankfort for a tour of flooded areas, Chandler noted President Eisenhower that a "large part of eastern Kentucky has been inundated by one of the most devastating floods in history. We request you declare this an emergency area."

The Army used helicopters to rush food and medicine to stricken areas in eastern Kentucky and the Red Cross sent workers into the stricken communities.

Ike Will Deny Senate Probe His Mideast Correspondence

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Eisenhower said today he by no means will give to Senators inquiring into Middle East policies any of his correspondence with other heads of state.

Eisenhower linked this assertion at his news conference with a thoroughgoing defense of Secretary of State Dulles.

Eisenhower said he approved from top to bottom the actions Dulles has taken in the international field. He said he had approved Dulles' policies in advance.

LAST TO DENY — Eisenhower added that he would be the last to deny that he and Dulles have made some mistakes.

But he said those members of Congress who are attacking the Secretary of State have not pointed to any specific errors and have not offered any constructive alternatives.

A reporter noted that in U. S. Middle Eastern operations over the last 11 years, the Senate Foreign Relations and Armed Services Committees had raised the question of what executive documents would be made available.

REPORTER ASKED — The reporter asked if Eisenhower would make available correspondence he has had with other heads of governments.

By no means, the President replied crisply. "That would be a betrayal of confidential relations with other world leaders," Eisenhower went on. He said that of course Congress was not asking for any such thing as that.
