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"Blame it on Dulles" has become one of the more prevenus and perilous period known as the Eisenbower years. Yet Mr. Dulles presses on heternally. racing the sun around the world, filling microphones and magazines with brilliant but tedious dissertations on the nature of foreign polley, preaching little sermons to friend and foe alike and ignoring totally the criticus heaped upon him. He presses on because he has one friend more powerful than the legion of his critics. The friend is Dwight D. Eisenbower.

Currently in the capital there is a new surge of speculation that Mr. Dulles, nearing 70, will soon retire. But this speculation, like that preceding it, seems to be based on eager hope rather than on solid indications that parting it is imminent. Just recently the President's continuing reliance on Dulles seemed to be suggested in their televised report on the NATO conference.
