RALEIGH — It was an invasion of privacy and the intruder knew this as he pushed into that sadness called the Wake Forest dressing room. No one spoke. The only noise was the soft splash of tears as they fell on the cement floor.

The scene can't adequately be described. I have watched men at war hear news of buddles being shot down and they recated much the same way. This was no funeral, but to those string on two thin red benches, their heads boxed, nothing really was alive.
