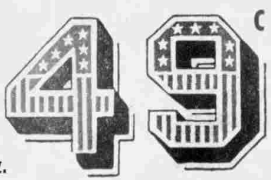

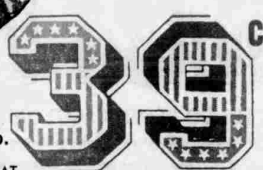

Empire Waistline Joins Harem Skirt With Grace

Using a contrasting fabric for the Empire bodice, the dress that crisscrosses in back at the normal waistline, he drapes the deeply V-neck into gathers beneath the front bow.

Set on a fitted lining, the bodice also features a slight extension at the shoulders.

The harem drape has the effect of separate overskirt, with a slim straight one underneath.

The fabric which is pleated into the waistline flows to the hem, folds over and doubles back to the waistline.

Ideal for any reversible, pleated fabric such as rayon or silk crepe, sheer cottons, very soft tulle or other party material, with satin, pique, de soie or faille for contrasting bias. From this size chart select the one size best for you.
