

## Ex-Resident Is Victim Of Shooting

A 50-year-old Chatham County farmer who lived at Winston-Salem 11 years ago was fatally shot when he was shot while at his home in the Baldwin town ship.

Clyde Sindle Sr. of Pittsboro, N.C., died of a 12-gauge shotgun wound to his head, Chatham County Coroner Clyde W. Thomas said.

The coroner said Sindle was shot as he was entering the back door of his home in the Baldwin town ship.

A coroner's jury a half-dozen members of the Baldwin town ship, including Sindle's wife, Mrs. Sindle, and three other men, was expected to meet today to hear testimony.

Sheriff Emerson said Mrs. Sindle told him her husband last Saturday, but returned to their home when he agreed to mend his ways and threats to her life.

However, Mrs. Sindle related that her husband continued drinking and threatening her life, the sheriff reported.

Mr. Sindle was born in December, 1908, in Yadkin County, N.C., and lived in Winston-Salem for several years before moving to Chatham County.

Law officers chased down and captured a Wilkes County man here last night driving a car loaded with 150 gallons of bootleg liquor. He was stopped when his car failed to stop at a red light.

ABC and Winston-Salem police officers said they ran down William Lee Lester, 42, of 2301 S. 1st St. on foot when he jumped and ran after the wreck at Reynolds and Stratford roads about 6:20 p.m.

They were found guilty of operating an 87-gallon capacity whisky still on a farm near Conowingo in northeast Maryland.

## Airport Plans Rain, Cold Expenditure Of \$350,000 For Today

GREENSBORO (AP)—During the first six months of 1959 the Greensboro High Point Airport Authority will spend some \$350,000 to improve the airport, J. T. Martin, authority chairman, said yesterday.

Martin said the Eastern Air Lines strike is costing the authority over \$400,000 a month in lost revenues. Eastern normally has 22 of the 37 daily flights at the airport.

Martin said 30 acres at the end of the southeast runway will be bought from John Van Landuyt for clear zone purposes and that the 100-acre area at the southwest runway will be bought from George Smith for the same purpose.

Martin said agreements had not been reached for the land purchases, but that about \$150,000 would be spent to renovate and install new air-conditioning equipment in the Weather Bureau station and another \$100,000 will be spent for engineering fees and other costs.
