The detection of crime and the apprehension of criminals for trial make up the principal duties of Charlotte's excellent police force. These cheres do not include any control. — real or implied, formal or informal — over the administration of the courts themselves.

It is true that the job of clerk has been held by one police officer for a number of years. But the City Council is certainly under no obligation to ap-

point another policeman to succeed him. The office should merely be occupied by the individual who can handle it in the hest. most efficient and effective way possible. Whether he is a policeman or not hardly matters.

At any rate, the decision properly rests with the City Council. Chief Littlephn owes it to the public to accept that decision gracefully.
