Wallace Based Campaign On Defiance Of U. S. Court

George Wallace, apparently the next governor of Alabama, based his winning campaign on defiance of the Federal Courts.

The former Golden Gloves state champion boxer, who called himself "The Fighting Judge," struck out hard at the Federal Courts during his campaign.

In the campaign, Wallace drew most applause when he bore down on the Federal Courts.

He said they were "lousy and irresponsible," and he called one Federal judge a "scalawag, carpet-bagger, race-mixing, bald-faced liar."

And the crowd roared.

Wallace worked mightily to create the image of "the fighting judge." And most of his biography speaks of a man who never dodged a fight.

"I've had to fight for everything I ever got," said Wallace during the campaign. "and I don't intend to stop now."

Sen. of Farmers

Wallace, who is 42 years old, grew up as the son of a small farmer in Barbour County. His father died in 1937.

That year, as a high school senior, Wallace fought his way into the state Golden Gloves heavyweight championship.

Then came college, and Wallace worked his way through the University of Alabama.

During World War II, Wallace joined the Army Air Corps and flew bombing missions over Japan as a flight engineer on a B-29.

After the war, Wallace ran for the Alabama House of Representatives from Barbour County—and won. It was the same year James E. Folsom won his way into the governor's mansion.

In the Legislature, Wallace and Folsom became buddies. Wallace wrote some of Folsom's speeches, and helped to guide some of Folsom's legislation through the Legislature.

Folsom's Manager

In 1954, Wallace served as Folsom's South Alabama campaign manager, and helped to elect the Culman Countant.

Wallace broke with Folsom during his second term, and the two haven't been friends since.
