her home in Texas. Police Chief Frank N. Littlejohn is trying to locate the woman to question her about the case. She has a police record which shows 31 arrests. Another case involved a woman arrested in September, 1957, and charged on two counts of prostitution. She was tried in city court Sept. 12, 1957, and was given six months in prison on each count, sentences to run consecutively. This means she would have to go to prison for one year.

NOTICE OF APPEAL

The defendant gave notice of appeal and her bond was set at \$10,000. Court records show that on Sept. 23 — 10 days after she was sentenced — both prison sentences were suspended on the condition she not violate any laws for a period of three years.

The woman withdrew her notice of appeal after the sentence was changed. Another woman was tried on prostitution charges in the city court on Jan. 29, 1957, and was given six months in prison.

On Jan. 31, 1957, her sentence was suspended for two years on the condition she pay a fine of \$50 and costs, live with her mother and become gainfully employed and be of good character. Another case involved a man arrested at a local hotel and charged with soliciting for prostitution.

He was tried in city court on Jan. 29, 1957, and sentenced to nine months in prison. He appealed and bond was set at \$2,000.

On Feb. 2, 1957, he came back to the city court and his original sentence was changed.

His prison sentence was suspended on the condition he violate no law for a period of three years, that he not work in a hotel or rooming house for three years, that he not associate with a certain woman for three years and that he pay a fine of \$100 and costs.

A notation on the warrant says: "The sentence is changed as above and appeal is withdrawn."

Judge J. B. McNeill said he was unavailable for comment.

Probers Want To Hear More About Convention

WASHINGTON (AP)—New York mobster Vito Genovese and Cleveland businessman John Scallish were summoned today by Senate investigators trying to find out about an alleged gangland conference in upstate New York.

Sen. John L. McClellan (D-N.J.), the committee chairman, called Genovese one of the top gangsters in the country.

The senator and Robert F. Kennedy, committee counsel, said Scallish, head of the Buckeye Cigarette Co. of Cleveland, was in trouble with the law back in the 1930's. His record since then is clear.

The committee is exploring what it says is a nationwide conspiracy by Mafia criminals to seize power in the business world and labor unions, and to establish fronts for extortion and other rackets.

The hearings so far have probed about an alleged crime syndicate meeting last November at Apalachin, N. Y.

Genovese and Scallish were among 58 persons the police rounded up after a raid on the meeting.

Another of those picked up was John Charles Montana, former member of the Buffalo, N. Y., City Council. Montana was chosen as the city's Man of the Year in 1956.
