

Restoration At Old WF Is Started

WAKE FOREST — Restoration work has begun on the birthplace of Wake Forest College in the Town of Wake Forest. It was announced yesterday by Dr. Christopher Critchfield, of Raleigh, president of the corporation that is restoring the house.

It is expected that the present phase of the work will be completed within a few months.

The work is being made possible by donations of materials and cash by friends of Old Wake Forest College. Funds are now in hand to assure the preservation of the exterior of the structure. It is expected that work on the interior will be undertaken later.

The house was the home of Dr. Samuel Wait, first president of Wake Forest Institute (later College) when it was opened in 1834. The house was moved at least twice and now stands on a large lot donated by the college.

Earlier, the building had been on the plantation of Dr. Calvin Jones, Massachusetts native who had migrated to North Carolina in 1793 and had quickly become one of the leading citizens of the state. Dr. Jones served as a physician, edited a Raleigh newspaper, became mayor of Raleigh, represented Wake County in the Legislature, was a founder of the North Carolina Medical Society and served as a general of militia in the War of 1812.

He sold the Baptist State Convention a part of his plantation, including his home, in 1832 to become the site of the proposed Baptist College. He reduced his price from \$2,500 to \$2,000, his gift to the new institution. In that day \$500 was equivalent to some \$5,000 today.

At the time Wake Forest College moved to Winston-Salem in 1896, the old campus, including the Calvin Jones House, was sold to the new Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary. When the house was about to be demolished to make way for a new structure, the seminary offered it to anyone who would move it away.

Then, under the leadership of Wait Brewer Sr., Mrs. Edith Farnshaw, Dr. E. E. Folk, Dr. I. Beverly Lake, William Royall, Dr. C. T. Wilkinson and other residents of Wake Forest, a corporation to preserve the house was formed and the building was moved to its present location.

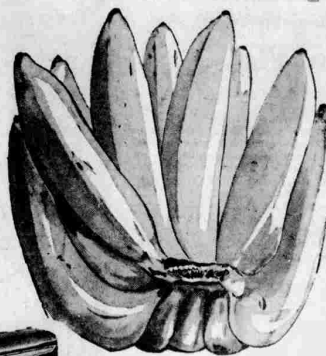

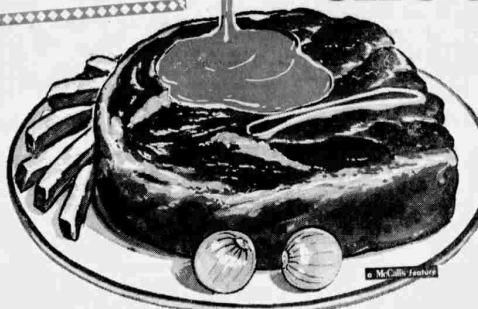
