Marion, Ga., September 25.—(AP)—A special committee of the Georgia Association of County Commissioners went on record here today as favoring unanimously the floating of \$75,000,000 in state highway bonds, nearly one-third of which amount will go to refund, in cash, money advanced by various counties toward the completion of their own system of roads.  
The recommendation, which will be made to the commissioners' association next April, and in turn to the general assembly of Georgia, was proposed by A. J. Lippert, of Albany, and seconded by Judge C. H. Brown, of Clarksville.  
Of the \$75,000,000 it is proposed that \$20,000,000 will go for the construction of hard surfaced highways and the other \$55,000,000, or such sum thereof as may be necessary, will be returned to the various counties in the form of cash, which would be advanced money to the state highway department for the construction of their own highways. Under that proposal each county would receive approximately \$250,000.
