

## Troops Go To Help Malaysia

KUALA LUMPUR, Malaysia (AP) — British and New Zealand battalions, acting under a Commonwealth defense treaty, moved into Malaysia's main island fighting front Friday to join the mop-up of Indonesian invaders.

They replaced two Malaysian battalions sent to Singapore to help that island state in the Malaysian federation put down new Malay-Chinese race conflicts. The rioting there counted eight dead and 60 injured since Wednesday before a rigid curfew and tight roadblocks helped end the outbreak.

The rioting Friday centered in the city's suburban Geylang area.

All Malaysia was in a state of emergency ordered by the Cabinet to meet what it called the threat of aggression by Indonesia, following the reported landing of about 30 Indonesian paratroopers Wednesday in the Labis area of Malaya.

In Jakarta, Indonesian President Sukarno, his foreign minister, Subandrio, and commanders of the armed forces held a meeting. Subandrio ordered them to "deploy their strength throughout Indonesia" to meet any possible attack.

Throughout the year since Malaysia was formed, Sukarno has been threatening a "crush Malaya" drive.

Subandrio spoke of movements of naval units in the waters between Indonesia and Malaysia but did not identify them.

British and New Zealand units have helped the Malaysians hunt down Indonesian infiltrators in Sabah and Sarawak (states of the federation on Borneo) and British naval units have stood by at various times.

But Friday was the first time the Commonwealth allies moved into action on the mainland.

## Six Men Are Killed In S.C. Auto Crash

ORANGEBURG, S.C. (UPI) — Six construction workers were killed Friday in a mauling two-car collision at a rural crossroads 12 miles west of here. A seventh was in critical condition.

The South Carolina highway patrol said the tragedy occurred when one car ran a stop sign on a farm-to-market road entering State Highway 4 at the Pine Hill community.

A second car, traveling on Highway 4, crashed into the side of the other car and pinned it against an 18-inch-thick utility pole.

Killed instantly were Walter F. Ritz, 38, of New Ellenton; Sammy Robert Ledford, 31, of Aiken; Ray Sighler, 26, of Gaston; and J. B. Lucas, 23, of Gaston.

Timothy Sighler, 17, of Gaston and Walter F. Ritz Jr., 22, of New Ellenton died at Orangeburg Regional Hospital.

## Car Theft Is Charged To Two Rowan Men

Two Rowan County men, charged here with car theft after the vehicle was found in a ditch, were charged with the theft of a 1962 Chevrolet.

Frank Jackson, 31, of Salisbury, R. I., and Jerry Mitchell, 31, of Salisbury, are to appear Sept. 10 in Municipal Court on the theft charge. Small is free on \$1,000 bond, but Grubbs remained in jail last night in lieu of bond.

Detective Sgt. E. J. Weatherman said Rowan County officers uncovered evidence which led to the arrest of the two men several days ago.

Weatherman said investigation led to a farm near Salisbury where the chopped-up remains of a vehicle stolen in Winston-Salem were found.

## 24 Negroes Rejected By Schools

Meridian, Miss. (AP) — Two dozen young Negroes — one of them the brother of slain civil rights worker James Chaney — were blocked Friday in attempts to enter public schools at five of the city's all-white elementary schools.

Public schools in this city of 10,000 — second largest in Mississippi — have not been ordered to desegregate by federal courts.

The Council of Federated Organizations — COFO, which represents the major civil rights groups active in this Deep South state, said it would take legal action to desegregate the facilities.

The integration move here was similar to attempts earlier this week by 19 Negroes to gain entrance into Canton Junior-Senior High School in rural Madison County, Canton, like Meridian, is not under court order to desegregate.

Meanwhile, it was disclosed that two Negroes had registered without incident to attend first-grade classes at a Catholic parochial school at Gulfport. It marked the first announced integration of Catholic schools in the state under a recent directive by Bishop R. O. Gerow that they should end operations on a segregated basis this fall, beginning with the first grade.

At Biloxi, 17 Negro children finished the first week of integrated classes in four previously all-white elementary schools. A lone Negro girl is attending school with whites at Carthage in rural Leake County.

Public schools at Jackson have registered 45 Negro first-graders for desegregated classes which begin Sept. 14 and the state public school system is under orders to desegregate but has not yet received any applications from Negroes.
