



Davidson College Band consisting of some 50 pieces more popularly known as "Davidson Radio Band" and is heard of local broadcasting stations throughout the college year.

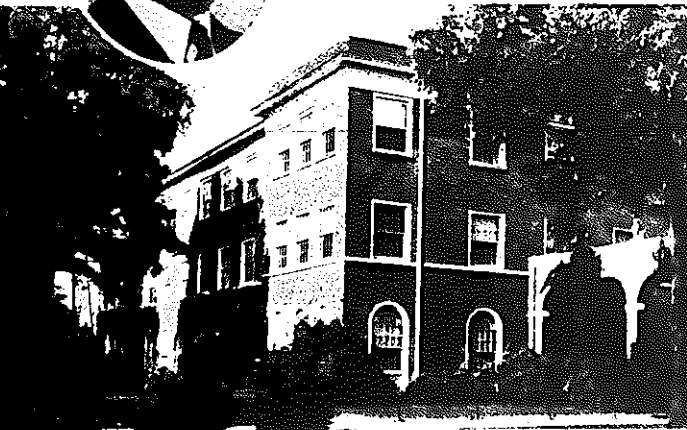

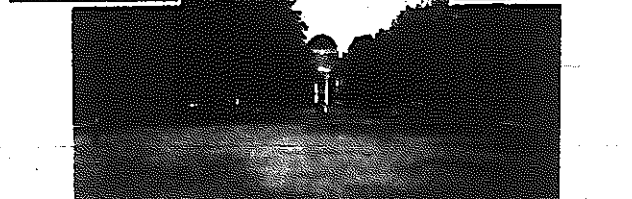
