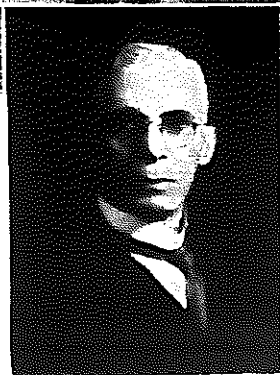

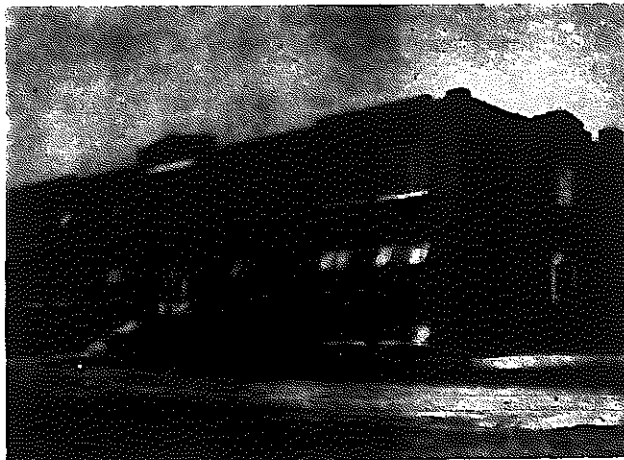
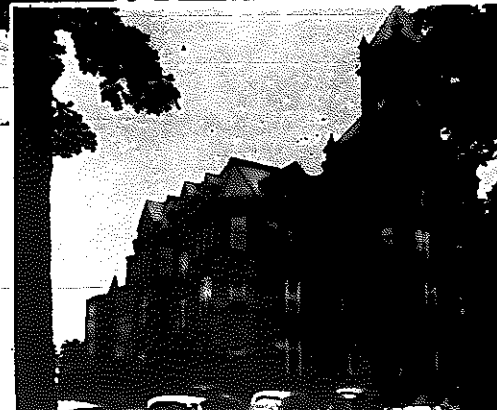

Rev. H. L. McCrorey, President
Johnson C. Smith University

Johnson C. Smith University, Charlotte, was established 1867. Until 1891 under control of white president and teachers. Rev. D. J. Saunders and colored faculty was appointed at the same time (1891). Dr. Henry L. McCrorey was appointed president of the University in 1907, at the death of Dr. Saunders, and has since served in that capacity. Dr. McCrorey specialized in Hebrew Language at Chicago University. He holds A.B., B.D. and L.L.D. degrees. Mrs. Johnson C. Smith, of Pittsburgh, Pa., has made extensive gifts to the University, hence the present name. Under control of the Presbyterian Church. Enrollment of approximately 1,000 students, including summer school and extension department enrollment. A total of 22 buildings and is a co-educational institution, this change being made as late as 1932. A move is on foot to raise money for additional building to accommodate girls. The University is well endowed and is one of the leading colored institutions of learning in the entire south.



Morris College, Sumter, South Carolina, established 1908, named for Frank Morris, pioneer Baptist preacher, who was influential in its organization. This college has no endowment. Seven buildings comprise the equipment. The plant represents approximately a quarter of a million dollars. 26 teachers comprise the faculty. A crying demand at the moment is a library. Effort is being launched to raise necessary funds for a 15,000 volume library. Dr. I. D. Pinson is president.



Established in 1880 by William F. Dickerson, Allen University, Columbia, S. C., offers the colored people of the south exceptional educational advantages. It is a co-educational school with a teaching staff of 20. The University has 312 students this year. A.B. and B.S. degrees conferred. Allen University has a 20-acre campus with seven splendid buildings. Dr. Eugene H. McGill has been President of the University since 1937.
