West Coast Watches For Possible Attack

SAN FRANCISCO—(AP)—Along the thousands of miles of Pacific coast, from California to the Belligerent Japan, soldier, sailor and civilian alike learned today the meaning of the alert.

From Alaska to the Panama Canal, along the coast of the Americas, measures were put into effect from a few minutes to a few hours after Japan's first air raid, audited on ships at Honolulu.

In the populous cities of the western seaboard, the first line of defense in case of attack came from the United States military and civilian agencies, laboring throughout the night to place the Far West on an efficient war footing.

Recall of week-end soldiers, sailors and marines to their posts was among the first orders.

Police stations were on the alert on the streets. Radios blared the news, Taxicabs carried the men.

Military Posts were hurried to civilian Blackouts were ordered in Alaska and Panama and at the big airplane repair depot at Searsmont.

San Diego's anti-submarine net was spread across the entrance to the huge harbor.

Pugot Sound Navy Yard

warned that any airplane that ever it would be fired upon.

Except for scheduled airships, all private aviation was grounded.

The thousands of amateur radio operators and others trained in volunteer air spotting service were on 24-hour-a-day watch.

On Calif. Col. L. Olson of California called for 10,000 volunteers to the California State Guard, to assist the National Guard.

Gov. Frank Merriam called a meeting of the State Council of Civilian Defense for Monday evening in Los Angeles.

State and local officials

met at the State Capitol in Sacramento.

At San Francisco, Lt. Col. George F. Johnson, commandant of Civilian Defense, planned to go to Los Angeles Tuesday.

Naval planes, bombers cruised

the coast. The giant coast defense guns of the Golden Gate

base, Pugot Sound Navy Yard

were held in readiness to fire

from 20 miles out to sea

to any raiders.

The giant mobile aircraft base at Los Angeles and Seattle and the shipyards on Puget Sound and San Francisco Bay were heavily guarded by海岸警衛隊

and other naval forces.

Shore bases, Bases of Los Angeles, radio towers and depots, including 50 plane

bases, were manned by 10,000

men of the major disaster com-

munity.

Automobiles in Los Angeles were

put on major and police duty

as cars only when necessary.

Shipping was bottled up by Government orders in the ports of Los Angeles and San Francisco, and all commercial calls and leave the Francisco were ordered to stay at anchor.

A welders' strike threatening to stop shipbuilding was broken off after a 48-hour Mayor Claude J. Hassel of San Francisco labor strikers called meetings Monday looking toward settlement of bitter dispute between the men of the shipyards and department stores.

California's large Japanese population generally kept to their homes. In San Francisco the Chinese section was closed off and guarded.
