THIAMIN IS ADDED

TO WHITE FLOURS.

The role of thismin, or vitamin, S. i. in unfoling morals has been definitely proved. England has legislated it into white flour by law to help build the morals of the people and to prevent it, nose and nerrous depressions resulting from bombing and crowded, conditions of air-raid shelters.

The same thing is baing understaken in this country by voluntary action: A five months ago the Millers Nuterial Pederalion and the National Reisul Bakers Association agreed voluntating to fortify white flour with thismin and nicotine and host of the B-1 complex, and iron. The U. S. Food and Drug Administration a few dars ago recommended that another item from the B-1 complex in the public health of the public health authorities in the hope of encouraging the whole nation to change over 10 it in place of the odd white flour, which has always been deficient in health-building vitamins.
