WASHINGTON — We are told that Hitler's next step will be to announce that he will no longer be a member of the League of Nations. But he already is leaving the League.

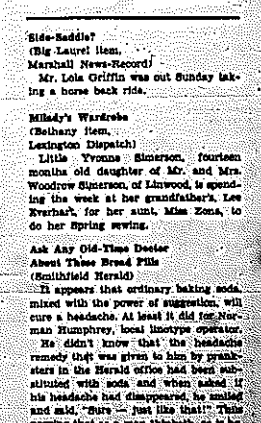
Invited Men Do Not Surrender to Slavery
