



Many Votes Thrown Out By Officials

Cong. Lyndon Johnson received ver 56 per cent of all Travis counvotes cast in heavy balloting for United States senator Saturday, with Atty, Gen. Gerald C. Mann holding a slight lead over Gov. Lee O'Daniel for second place. A total of 13,297 votes had been reported, with approximately 75 still to come

With all city boxes included, and all but six small rural boxes report-ed, the Travis county vote stood:

There were 10,877 votes counted in the city precincts. Of these Johnson received 6,246; Mann, 2,372; O'Daniel, 1,862, and Dies, 397.
