MOSCOW. — (AP) — The Germans, grinding slowly forward in an industrial district of Stalingrad but with victory still denied them there, were reported today to have started anew on a wide flanking invasion further south, obviously calculated to cut through the Kalmyck territory to the Volga delta on the Caspian Sea.

## AEF Planes Wreck Span

### Bridge Destroyed To Cut Burma Railway

NEW DELHI, India. — (AP) — Bombers destroyed a bridge to cut a Burma railway at work end and attacked barracks, troops and other military facilities of the Japanese in northern Burma and the adjoining Chinese province of Yunnan.

Explosives tossed from a low level by multi-based planes were reported to have completely shattered the bridge south of Mogaung on a line that terminates at Mogaung.

In addition to destruction of the bridge, the communists said, 200 feet of railroad cut and 600 feet of track were damaged.
